NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES: (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

Department of Health: Board of Medical and Osteopathic Examiners: (August 13, 2007) intends to adopt rules to clarify to licensees the following: physician fees chargeable by the board; supervision requirements between the physician assistant and the supervising physician and physician assistant fees chargeable by the board; physical therapist and physical therapist assistant fees chargeable by the board; athletic trainer continuing education requirements; and occupational therapist and occupational therapy assistance continuing education requirements. The general authority for this rule, as cited by the board, is SDCL 36-4-35, 36-4A-42, 36-10-32, 36-10-33, 36-10-35.1, 36-10-36, 36-29-17, and 36-31-13.

A public hearing will be held in the Burgundy Room of the Holiday Inn City Center, 100 West 8th Street, Sioux Falls, South Dakota, on September 11, 2007, at 11:00 a.m. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained from and written comments sent to the South Dakota Board of Medical and Osteopathic Examiners, 125 S. Main Avenue, Sioux Falls, South Dakota 57104. Written comments must be received by September 3, 2007, to be considered. Persons who have special needs for which the board can make arrangements may call (605) 367-7781, before the hearing.

Department of Agriculture: South Dakota Pulse Council: (August 14, 2007) intends to adopt rules to establish the election procedures for the council members of the South Dakota Pulse Council. Criteria being considered are

nomination, qualifications, notice of vacancy, certification of candidates, election process, ballots, voter eligibility, certification of election, canvas of election and terms of office. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL 38-34-3.

A public hearing will be held in Foss Building, 1st floor, Mathew Training Center, Pierre, South Dakota, on September 6, 2007, at 1:00 p.m. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained without charge from and written comments sent to South Dakota Department of Agriculture, Attn: Jon Farris, 523 E. Capitol Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota 57501. Material sent by mail must reach the department by September 16, 2007, to be considered. This hearing is being held in a physically accessible place. Persons who have special needs for which the department can make arrangements are asked to call (605) 773-5436 at least 48 hours before the public hearing.

Department of Revenue and Regulation: Commission on Gaming: (August 15, 2007) is proposing to amend Racing Rules to define the terms “independent real time monitoring system” and “pari-mutuel ticket” under the multi-jurisdictional hub account wagering rules; set forth the requirements to be maintained within all totalizator rooms in multi-jurisdictional totalizator hub operations; require that computer systems at hubs be supported by an uninterruptible power supply to allow for system shutdown if power failures occur; require that the totalizator system utilized by the hub be capable of transmitting data in real time to an independent real time monitoring system; set forth the requirement of certain end-of-day reports, including balance report for wagering

devices, wagering summary report for every pool and for each race, system balance report comparing pool and paid out totals, money room balance report showing cash added and subtracted from beginning day's balance, and IRS report showing winner's social security number, ticket number amount won and taxes withheld; require hubs to produce any reports requested by the Commission within 72 hours after the receipt of such request – the reports may include, but are not limited to, odds progression report, ticket and transaction history report, terminal history report, outstanding ticket report, outstanding tickets cashed report, manually cashed tickets report, canceled tickets report, network balance report, teller inquiry report, wagering report, account history report, inter-track wager report, ticket history report and terminal history report, pool transmission report, and special reports; require hubs to produce daily logs to the Commission which include at a minimum: a teller/machine history log, ticket history log, user terminal log, system error log, system journal log, and account history log; and require hub personnel to maintain off-line logs which include at a minimum: system incident log, totalizator room access log and totalizator maintenance log; amend Gaming Rules to allow licensees the discretion to conduct game tournaments on dates of their choosing for tournaments with buy-ins or entry fees of \$50 or less per player; exclude mandatory gratuities paid to licensed dealers from the adjusted gross proceeds of tournaments; eliminate the requirement that licensees conducting tournaments file reports within 48 hours of the conclusion of the tournament except for those licensees conducting tournaments which retain \$250 or more; allow licensees to utilize automatic clearing houses for electronic funds transfers on check cashing; repeal standard financial statement requirements; and update requirements of audited financial statements for licensed operators and route operators. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the commission, is SDCL 42-7-56, 42-7B-7, and 42-7B-11.

A public hearing will be held at the City Hall, 102 Sherman Street, Deadwood, South Dakota, on September 12, 2007, at 9:00 a.m. MT. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained without charge from and written comments sent to the South Dakota Commission on Gaming, 221 West Capitol Avenue, Suite 101, c/o 1320 East Sioux Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota 57501-3100. Materials sent by mail must reach the Commission on Gaming by September 12, 2007, to be considered. However, the Commission requests that all written comments be received by September 6, 2007, to allow for adequate consideration prior to the hearing. This hearing is being held in a physically accessible place. Persons who have special needs for which the commission can make arrangements are asked to call (605) 773-6050 or (605) 578-3074 at least 48 hours before the hearing.
