NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES: (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

Department of Health: (October 5, 2004) has filed rules to add pediatric influenza deaths to the list of reportable events and to simplify the "standard precautions" disease control measure section. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL 34-1-17, 34-22-9, 34-22-12, and 34-23-13.

A public hearing will be held in the State Health Laboratory large conference room, 615 East Fourth Street, Pierre, South Dakota, on November 3, 2004, at 9:00 a.m. to consider the adoption and amendment of proposed rules. Department of Environment and Natural Resources: Water and Natural Resources Board: (October 7, 2004) has filed rules to establish a procedure for the management of the State's Brownfields Revitalization and Economic Development Program funds as provided by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The establishment of the rules include

clarification on how the Water and Natural Resources Board will administer Brownfields Revolving Loan Subfunds; clarification on how state Brownfields Assessment and Cleanup Subfunds will be administered; and liability protection for state designated Brownfields sites. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is 46A-1-102 and 46A-1-103.

A public hearing will be held at the Matthew Training Center, 523 E. Capitol Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota, on Friday, November 5, 2004, at 1:00 p.m. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained without charge from and written comments sent to the Department of Environment and Natural Resources, Ground Water Quality Program, Joe Foss Building, 523 East Capitol Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota 57501. Written comments must reach the Division of Environmental Services, Ground Water Quality Program by 5:00 p.m. November 4, 2004, to be considered. DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES:

On October 7, 2004, the department filed revisions to the Food Stamp Program Certification and Accountability Manual. The revisions relate to complementary income, the exemptions for able-bodied adults without dependents, increase in income guidelines, the thrifty food plan, the standard deduction, the

maximum shelter deduction and resource limits for disabled individuals.
